## **Short-Answer and Long Essay**

As we move into the new test we will be incorporated the new free-response style questioning. So in your summer assignment you will be writing a short-answer style question and then a long-essay based on your reading. These will be due on **August** 18th!

**Short Answer** - These should be relatively short and right to the point. (No more than a paragraph for each letter.)

- 1. Historians have argued that the adoption of agriculture during the Neolithic Revolution was one of the most important transformations in human history.
  - A. Identify and explain ONE positive result of the Neolithic Revolution.
  - B. Identify and explain ONE negative result of the Neolithic Revolution
  - C. Identify and explain ONE feature that distinguished the Neolithic Age from the Paleolithic Age

**Long Essay** – Choose <u>one</u> of the two questions and these should be a little longer in length. (No more than two pages).

**Question 1:** Compare the civilizations of the ancient Near East with ancient China.

**Question 2:** Compare the civilizations of the ancient Near East with ancient India.
